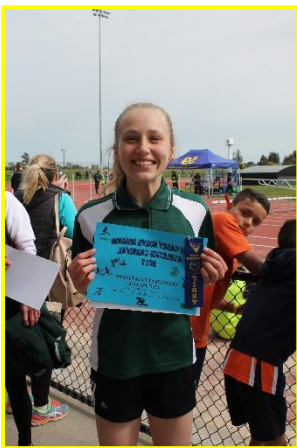

# *FROM THE PRINCIPAL*

## **Chalcot Lodge Uniform**

The absolutely great thing about school uniforms is that they make everyone feel like they belong; they're economical, easy to wash and wear, eliminate competition about who is the trendiest, and nurture a sense of school pride. The annoying thing about school uniform is that it is difficult to discern the owner of items, unless they are clearly labelled with the name and class of the student. Whilst it is true that uniform is economical in terms of their cost and the amount of daily use they get, it becomes a very annoying, expensive and inconvenient matter when they are lost.

On some occasions, students inadvertently pick up someone else's jumper or hat and the owner's parents are faced with needing to buy another one. With the holidays coming along, this is a great opportunity for you to check that your child does have their own uniform and please label all garments, particularly those which children take off during the school day.

## **Staff Car Park Safety**

I would like to remind parents that the staff car park is not to be used for parking, picking up or dropping off their children. Parents using Primrose Hill Close are also asked to remind their children of our Think Safe rule and that the safest and only entry to the school is via the pedestrian gate in front of the school.

For safety reasons, **students and parents are not permitted to enter or leave the school ground via the staff car park gate.**

**The pedestrian gate next to the bumper will be locked at all times.**

## **School Hats**

Just a reminder, that beginning next term, all students **must** wear their school uniform broad brim hat when outside. Students who do not have their hats during recess times will be asked to stay under the covered way adjacent to the office.

## **Term 4 Swimming Program – Beginning Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> October**

If your child is participating in the swimming program next term, please note that for safety reasons, all students must wear a swimming cap when swimming at North Lodge. The cost of the excursion included a silicone swimming cap embroidered with the Chalcot Lodge School logo.

If your child is an asthmatic, please ensure that their medication is taken to the pool with them. If your child is anaphylactic, ensure that two EpiPens are taken to swimming each day. It is the parent's responsibility to provide an extra EpiPen to be taken with the child to swimming. Anaphylactic students who do not have two EpiPens will not be permitted to attend.

## **Term 4 Cooking Program**

Thank you to all our wonderful parent helpers who have worked so hard during our Cooking classes this term. Just a reminder that due to our whole school Swimming Program, the Cooking Program will commence week 3, Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> October.

## **Year 3/4 Gleneagles Cup**

As part of the Year 3/4 Sport Program, students will be visiting Gleneagles Secondary College and participating in the “Gleneagles Cup” on Monday 16th October. During this term, Year 3/4 students participated in sport sessions in either Basketball, Netball, Soccer or Volleyball in preparation for this event. During the Gleneagles Cup, students will participate in a round robin competition against other local primary schools in the sport for which they have been trained.

Unfortunately, this event does clash with the Swimming Program. Children attending the Gleneagles Cup will need to forgo the swimming lesson for that day and the lesson cannot be made-up or financially reimbursed.

## **2018 Term Dates**

The first day of Term 1, Monday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2018 is a student-free day in all government schools to allow for appropriate planning to take place for the arrival of students. Each year government schools are provided with four student-free days for professional development, school planning & administration, curriculum development, and student assessment & reporting purposes. The second day of the school year (Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> January) will also be a designated, school council approved curriculum day. During this day, Teachers and Educational Support Officers will develop curriculum programs for Term 1 in line with the Victorian Curriculum. Staff will also become familiar with the Department of Education and Training’s new ‘High Impacted Teaching Strategies’.

- \* Prep students will have a staggered commencement on either Thursday 1st or Friday 2nd February (parents will be notified of their child’s start day). Prep students do not attend on Wednesdays during February, unless by appointment for assessment.

## **Term 4 - Wearing School Hats is Compulsory**

As part of our Sun Smart Policy, students must wear a uniform hat during Terms 1 and 4 for all outdoor activities. During Physical Education and sporting activities students are required, where possible, to wear a hat or remain in the shade.

## **Emergency Information in Preparation for Term 4**

So that parents may be contacted quickly, in the case of serious illness or injury at school, your children's emergency information must be up dated as necessary during the year (eg. change of occupation, change of emergency contacts, change in address or home, work or mobile telephone number, etc.). Please notify the office promptly if you need to make changes to your children's information. The school must also be advised of the granting of court orders relating to your children. A copy of any current court order must be given to the school.

## **How You can Help in the Fight to Prevent Vandalism**

Our school is **PRIVATE PROPERTY** and not for public use, and as such, school grounds cannot be used as thoroughfares or places for loitering.

All matters of school security are controlled by the Emergency Management Department of Education and Training It is very important to make notes about any suspicious vehicles or people before contacting the police or Emergency Management. The notes should include information such as vehicle type and registration numbers and the descriptions of any person/s acting suspiciously, causing wilful damage or behaving inappropriately on our school premises.
